TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS

This singular property was originally built as a defensive fortress. Its aim was, together with the castle located across the estuary, protect and defend the port against pirates and corsairs. This is the reason why this and many other fortifications in the area were built.

Raised during the second half of the 18th century, the stone walls compose the whole enclosure, the battlement, the towers, as well as the building and the paving, inside and outdoors.

This magnificent castle known as "Cardinal Castle" is located in the Corcubi3n estuary, the same as the mythical cape Finisterre, is the northernmost estuary of the southern coast of Galicia, denominated R3as Baixas, and makes part of the Costa da Morte (or Death Coast).

It is very well communicated and located half an hour from A Coru3a and an hour and a half from Santiago de Compostela. Both cities have airports that connect them to the rest of the country and with the most important towns in the world.

ABOUT THE AREA

Spain, a country on Europe's Iberian Peninsula, includes 17 autonomous regions with diverse geography and cultures. Capital city Madrid is home to the Royal Palace and Prado museum, housing works by European masters. Segovia has a medieval castle (the Alcázar) and an intact Roman aqueduct. Catalonia's capital, Barcelona, is defined by Antoni Gaudí's whimsical modernist landmarks like the Sagrada Família church.

Galicia, an autonomous community in Spain's northwest, is a verdant region with an Atlantic coastline. The cathedral of regional capital Santiago de Compostela is the reputed burial place of the biblical apostle Saint James the Great, and the destination for those following the Camino de Santiago pilgrimage route. The western cliffs of Cape Finisterre were considered by the Romans to be the end of the known world.

A Coruña is a port city on a promontory in the Galicia region of northwest Spain. It's known for its Roman lighthouse, the Tower of Hercules, which has sweeping coastal views. In the medieval old town is the arcaded Plaza de María Pita, surrounded by narrow pedestrianized lanes. In this square is the Estatua de María Pita, a statue of a 16th-century woman who warned the town of an invasion by Sir Francis Drake.
