This stunning three storey beach house is one of only five individual homes set on the east facing side of Benar Headland, a short stroll away from the centre of this acclaimed Welsh village. Bespoke built to take full advantage of the amazing views and elevated setting there are two levels of terraces with glass balustrades accessed via bi-fold doors from the principal rooms. A plunge pool is set within the lower, deeper terrace and private steps lead down to the beach and the sea. Changing and showering facilities are on the lower ground floor level too, keeping potentially wet and sandy areas contained. The property is approached from the SCYC car park and double gates open to a secure parking area atop a large external store, perfect for sailing and boating paraphernalia. Steps lead down to the main entrance at the middle floor. The amazing atrium style hall with its cloakroom and bespoke staircase has practical and attractive Travertine tiling. This extends into the well-appointed kitchen/dining room with integrated Siemens appliances, quartz surfaces and plenty of dining space which extends out to the rear terrace via bi-fold doors. The dining area opens to the bright sitting room, again with bi-fold doors opening onto the balcony, a contemporary wood burning stove and warm oak floors create a haven in the out of season months with natural light flooding through from the gallery and atrium
